The successful applicant will have a real passion for changing the lives of young people and their families. The OT will share their knowledge and provide support to upskill and empower the child's educational establishment and their wider support team.

Main Duties/Responsibilities

The purpose of this role is:

1. Undertake clinical work with individuals and groups of clients. May work independently or with other OT colleagues, or as part of a multidisciplinary team. Provide advice, strategies and programmes, as agreed, to the team around the CYP including parents/carers.

2. Provide direct 1:1 and group therapy, programmes, training and support for CYP in their homes and educational placements.
3. Establish and maintain liaison with parents/carers and other professionals for the comprehensive management of clients. Includes attendance and participation at case conferences / annual reviews as agreed in advance.
4. In all situations, communicate complex and sensitive information to clients/parents where there will often be significant barriers to understanding.
5. Work collaboratively as part of a multidisciplinary team providing support and practical advice for the team including families, education and other health professionals around the child on how to optimise the environment and meet the needs of the child.
6. To attend meetings and provide reports as agreed in the individual CYP contract, including Annual Reviews.
7. Maintain and provide accurate and timely documentation e.g. patient records and reports, sharing with others as appropriate, observing data protection guidelines and adhering to HCPC guidelines.
8. Ensure good time keeping and planning, to execute the role effectively.
9. Record contact electronically within 24 hours.
10. Adhere to procedures, policies and standards for service delivery within own specialist area and advise line manager of any resources required.
11. Demonstrate progression of clear therapeutic aims as appropriate to clinical setting, with the use of outcome measures.
12. Refer matters that may impact on service delivery to Line Manager or other authority before acting.
13. Follow best practice OT standards in accordance with national, regional and professional standards.
14. Comply with the RCOT Code of ethics and Professional Conduct, and HCPC Professional Standards and Local Policies at all times.
15. Be responsible for ensuring that own practice is safe and appropriate in accordance with HCPC. Including taking responsibility for own clinical supervision and CPD. Meet the required level of continuing professional development as stated by RCOT.
- 16.** Provide support for other members of the Occupational Therapy team including Occupational Therapy students and Assistants.
17. Signpost OT colleagues, education colleagues and parents to information on occupational needs in CYP.
18. Maintain and develop knowledge of national and international legislation that affects and informs clinical practice, such as the Mental Capacity Act etc.
19. Collect statistical data and be involved in the use of audit and outcomes to measure and improve quality of care.

20. Observe personal duty of care in relation to equipment and resources in course of work and highlight the need for ordering further equipment as required.

Qualification, relevant knowledge, and skills required

Successful candidates must have:

- Degree / Masters in Occupational Therapy
- HCPC and RCOT registration
- Completed NQP competencies
- Evidence of CPD
- Full driving license
- Enhanced DBS
- demonstrated ability to use evidence-based practice
- evidence of working with CYP aged 0-25
- Ability to work independently and show initiative
- Strong clinical reasoning and professional skills
- Good verbal and written communication skills
- Enthusiasm, motivation and passion
- Evidence of being a strong team player with a genuine desire to help others
- Good organisational skills
- Demonstrated discretion, diplomacy, resiliency, and professionalism
